


HUNTER'S Yard

Greetings from all of us at Hunter's Yard as we move into our annual maintenance phase, in which all the boats are moved into the sheds. That's quite a task as you can imagine.





The boats were all inside by the third week of October, which has been the deadline for about ninety years. The sheds are now sheltering our fourteen cabin yachts and eight half-deckers, a couple of guest yachts and four guest half-deckers. It ends up very crowded as you can see from last year's plan (overleaf). Despite this, there is still just enough room to work on, round and under the boats. Our team is very agile!



Scarfing, planking, scraping, varnishing and servicing

A lot of work, (including the following), has to be completed before the new season starts from March.

- Hustler 1 (built 1936) is having a new transom and deck covering
- Hustler 2 and Wood Sorrel need replacement planks and deck covering
- Wood Avens, Lustre and Lullaby cabin-top canvas will be replaced.
- There are new sails and covers to come in the New Year.
- One of the guest Rebels is having extensive replacement of frames and planks aft.

- The electric quant motors are supposed to be serviced after 1500 hours but, as we don't have a way of monitoring their use while under hire, they are all sent off for service each winter. That has been a bit delayed by the flooding but should happen soon.
- Rubbing down of <u>every</u> boat is being completed, too, prior to revarnishing.
- Masts and spars all sanded and varnished.
- Rigging checked and replaced where necessary
- plus a hundred and one other small jobs

Fry-up Friday, when we have a bit of a treat during lunch break, is extra welcome at the moment!

Global warming?

For some weeks the sheds have been under three to four inches of water at high tide and Ian, who has been here for forty-two years, says it has never been like this for so long. Tom, Ian's dad, who was here for over sixty years was in this morning and he, too, said he had never seen the like.

The combination of high tides, a full moon, low pressure and extraordinary volumes of rain may be something to do with it, but rain will not stop play and work goes on.

We had to put off a work-experience student starting in November due to the flooding in the sheds, but hopefully she will join us in January to try turning her hand from cabinet-making to boat-building; there is a hatch to be done which has a few challenges built into it.

We are hoping to take on a full-time apprentice at some point as part of a programme to support heritage crafts. There is a lot of attention in the press around endangered craft skills and boatbuilding is on the list.

The Trust owns Titmouse and Lullaby, which was Teasel in the film. Amazon is available for hire, as is Lullaby/Teasel. Swallow is being renovated by us in a major piece of work.


The Friends of Hunter's Fleet
